Teacher's Guide for KWLQ Chart

Purpose

Students make notes about what they know, what they want to know, what they learned, and what questions they still have about a topic.

Time

This chart should be used before and after reading.

Classroom Setup

Independent; whole group

Materials

KWLQ Graphic Organizer, pencil

Management Tips

Create a poster of the KWLQ Chart to hang on the wall for reference.

Steps

- 1. Introduce the topic and have students write the topic on the top of their charts.
- 2. In the first column, have students record what they already know about the topic.
- 3. In the second column, have students record what they want to know about the topic.
- 4. Have students read the texts about the topic.
- 5. In the third column, have students record what they learned about the topic.
- 6. In the fourth column, have students record questions they still have about the topic.

Variations

- Color coordinate each section.
- Have students use sticky notes to identify each section.
- Allow students with lower levels of writing ability to draw their responses.
- Have students discuss each column in small groups before recording their answers independently.

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
